## City of San Diego Leaders Urge Residents to Follow Public Health Rules, Stay Connected in New Video

SAN DIEGO – As residents continue to follow a statewide stay-at-home order, the City of San Diego today released a new public service announcement that features the City's elected leaders offering ways to stay safe, follow County public health guidelines and help others during the COVID-19 pandemic.
